The main aim of the project, however, is to have a wide range of films that tell the many different stories of people in Glasgow and beyond. It's a big screen and there is space for everyone on it.

Whether you're already a filmmaking pro or completely new to it, we've teamed up with the BBC Scotland to offer a series of free online filmmaking workshops which will:

- Show you how you can use your phone or other basic equipment to record your film
- Explore how to develop an engaging storyline
- Provide tips on how to frame different shots
- Give you advice on lighting and sound
- Upskill you on editing and production
